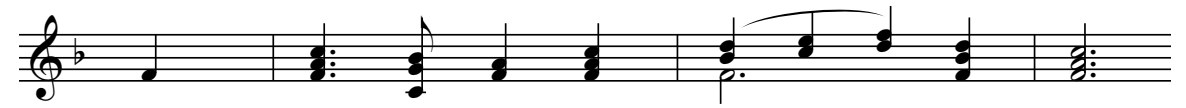

The Forty Holy Martyrs of Sebaste

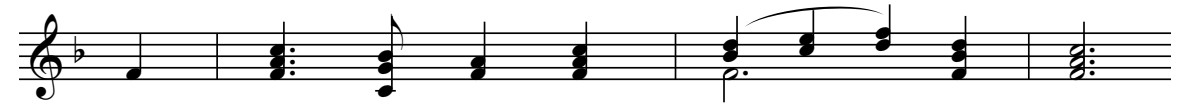





Prokeimenon - Tone 8 (Psalm 75:12,2):




Make vows to the Lord your God, to the Lord your God and ful-fill them,




