Our holy fathers Alexander, John, and Paul the Younger, patriarchs of Constantinople. Alexander took part in the First Ecumenical Council. (340) John the Faster governed the Church in the days of the wicked emperor Anastasius. (595) Paul IV governed the Church for five years and then took the Great Schema to repent for his early support of the Iconoclasts. (784)


My soul is waiting for the Lord. I count on his word.

 that our souls be saved.


Cantor: Let the watchman count on daybreak,

prayer, you be-came an earthly an-gel, a heav - en - ly man. In - ter-cede




be-fore Christ that our souls be giv - en peace and great mer - - cy.

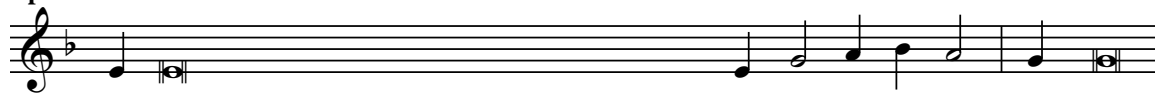

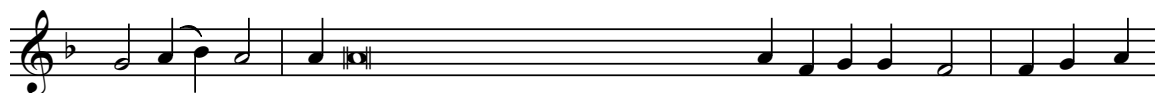
An evil birthday and a lustful banquet is celebrated by Her - od to - day; for having



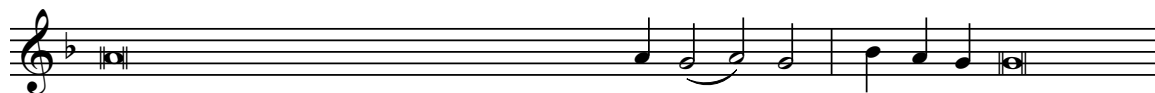
delighted in adultery and being driven by lust - ful de - sires, he be - head - ed the Bap - tist.



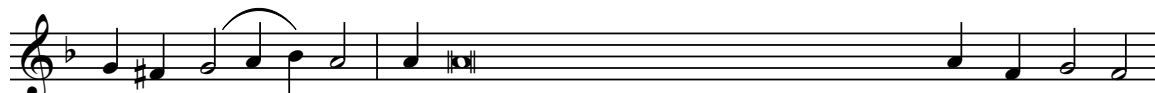
But he could not stop the tongue of the Proph - et which con - demned his
