Sunday of the Ancestors


*Supplement for The Order of Vespers for Sundays After Pentecost, 2006*

**Cantor:** (Tone 6) If you, O Lord, should mark our guilt, Lord who would survive?  
(on 6) But with you is found forgiveness: for this we revere you.

**Cantor:** Let the watchman count on daybreak
