He preached in Phrygia with John the Theologian, and Bartholomew. Philip was crucified there upside down on a tree.

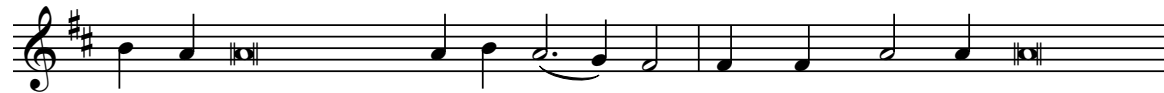
