
Vesper Propers, May 8, 2011 Sunday of the Myrrhbearers Third Paschal Sunday

All page numbers refer to the Paschal Vespers Book.

The holy apostle and evangelist John the Theologian, who, son of Zebedee, with his brother James and Peter was a witness of the transfiguration and also of the passion of the Lord. At the cross he took Mary as his mother, at the command of the dying Lord. In the Gospel and his other writings he shows himself to be a theologian. He was found worthy to contemplate the glory of the incarnate Word, which he saw and proclaimed.

Look on my right and see: there is no one who takes *my* part.


I have no means of escape, not one who cares for **my** soul.


I cry to you, O Lord.


I have said: "You are my refuge, all I have in the land of *the* living."


Listen, then, to my cry for I am in the depths of *distress*.


Rescue me from those who pursue me for they are stronger *than* I.













But with you is found forgiveness: for this we revere you.



Aposticha




The aposticha continue with the Paschal Stichera. The faithful come forward to kiss the cross as at Paschal Matins.











Doxastikon of the holy apostle and evangelist John - Tone 6









Troparion of the Resurrection - *Tone 2*






