
Supplement for The Order of Vespers for Sundays after Pentecost, 2006



 in - to her womb and gave him milk from her breast.




Come, O lov - ers of feasts, let us now sing and dance. Let us cel - e-brate

(on 2) acclaim him all you peoples!


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All cre - a - tion is joyfully be-ing en-riched to-day, O ev - er-praised
