(on 6) But with you is found forgiveness: for this we revere you.



(on 5) My soul is longing for the Lord more than watchman for daybreak.


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He who is car-ried by the Cher-u-bim has taken human nature in the abode of


The faith-ful and God-wise youths are radiant with joy in the fur-nace.


Dan-iel was a be-lov-ed man. He saw you, O Lord, as the Rock which was

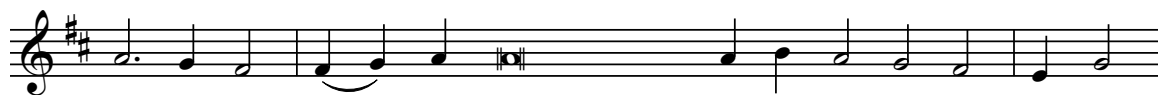
