

In u - nion with Great Mar - tyr George, We praise you with - out end!


Immediately after the opening blessing, the following is sung once by the priest and then twice by the faithful:

sac - ri - fice to God. There - fore, you received a crown of vic - to - ry,



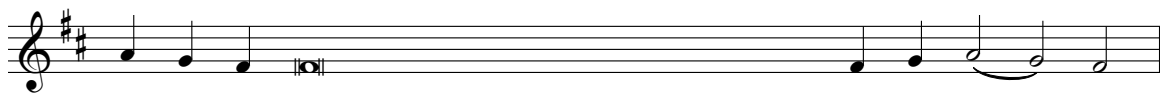
and through your pray'rs, O ho - ly one, you obtain for-give - ness of sins for all.

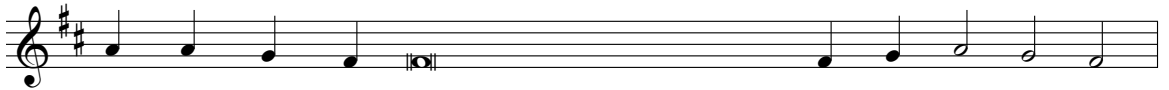

**Alleluia of the holy great-martyr George - Tone 4 (Psalm 91:13,14):**







temp - ta - tion, but de - liv - er us from e - - vil.






