The holy martyr Dorotheus, bishop of Tyre in Phoenicia. When still a priest, he suffered many things under the emperor Diocletian, and survived until the times of Julian the Apostate. Under him, at the age of 107, it is related that the venerable man adorned with honor his old age by his martyrdom in Thrace. (362)


