
Supplement for The Order of Vespers for Sundays After Pentecost, 2006

Stichera of the postfeast - Tone 1 podoben: Nebesnych činov


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The Cross is raised and the de-mons are scat-tered. The thief

who were named af - ter the vir - tues, showed them - selves to be among


the most ra - diant. They suf - ered the passion and defeated the E - vil One

(on 1) he is faithful forever.


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The no - ble ones were not concerned about fire, tor - ture, and death, be - cause

Aposticha doxastikon of the post-feast - Tone 1


Ja - cob, the Pa - tri - arch, prefigured your Cross, O Christ, when he blessed his
