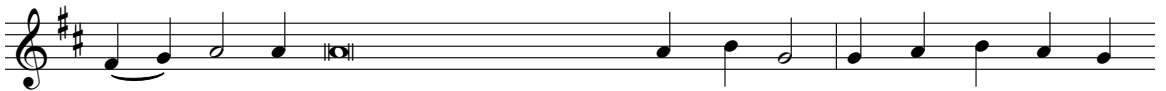

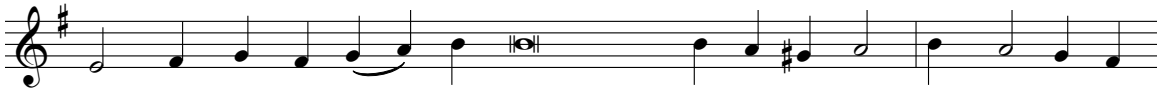

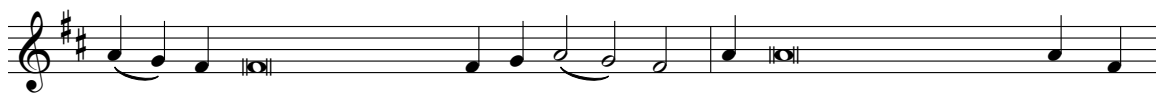

O true Lov - er of all of us, Sav - ior of all cre - a - tion.



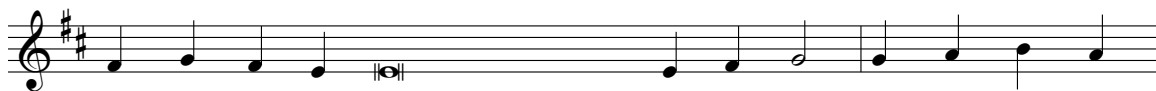

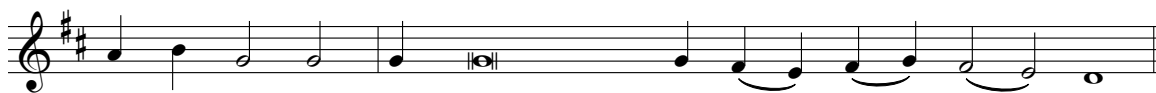



Prokeimenon of the Resurrection - Tone 7 (Psalm 28:11,1,2):




The Lord will give strength to his peo - ple; the Lord

Verse: Bring to the Lord, you sons of God; bring to the Lord glory and honor.



Alleluia of the Resurrection - Tone 7 (Psalm 91:2,3):




