

Vesper Propers, October 29, 2023
Twenty-second Sunday after Pentecost

The holy venerable martyr Anastasia. Born in Rome to wealthy and upper-class parents, she was left an orphan at age three. She was taken to a women's monastery to live, under the guidance of the Hegumena Sophia. When she was seventeen, the pagan governor summoned her to defend herself, which she did with great eloquence. She was stripped, tortured, and finally mutilated by the guards. This was during the persecution of the emperor Decius (249-251).




