

(on 3) Israel indeed he will redeem from all its iniquity.




Liv-ing an an - gel - ic life, you be - came a vessel of God through

(on 2) acclaim him all you peoples.




Filled with di - vine knowledge, you became a shepherd of the spi - rit - u - al flock
