

Troparion of the Transfiguration: Tone 7 (sung twice)




You were trans-fig-ured on the mountain, O Christ our God, re-veal-ing as

Through the splen-dor hidden under the flesh of your na-ture, you showed the disciples

the splendor of your divine beauty on Mount Ta - bor. Thus you en-light-ened

as with a robe. Trans-figured before your dis - ci - ples, you shone more bright-ly

than the sun. Mo-ses and E - li - jah stood at your side re - vealing you as Lord

of the living and the dead. They glo - rified your ineffable work of sal - va - tion,

your mer - cy and your great com - pas - sion, by which you saved the world,

which was lost in sin.

① You were born of a virginal cloud and be-came flesh and were transfigured on

Mount Ta-bor, O Lord. A bright cloud sur-round-ed you; the voice of the Father

clearly told the disciples that you are his be - lov - ed Son, for you are the same

to carry out the sentence pre-ordained: *
this honor is for all *his* faithful.

Psalm 150 Praise God in his holy place, *
praise him in his mighty heavens.

Cantor: Praise him for his powerful deeds,
(on 4) praise his surpassing greatness.

Be - fore your noble suffering and cross, O Mas - ter, you took your chosen
a - pos-tles to Mount Ta - bor, show-ing them your glo - ry. When they saw you
trans-figured and more brill-iant than the sun they fell to the ground and cried out:
You are the eternal light and the radiance of the Fa-ther; and al-though un-changed,
you ap - pear in the flesh.

Cantor: O praise him with sound of trumpet
(on 3) praise him with lute and harp. (*Repeat "Before your noble suffering..."*)

Cantor: Praise him with timbrel and dance,
(on 2) praise him with strings and pipes.

O God the Word, you are from all e - ter - ni - ty, and you are clothed with light

the disciples who were with you, O Christ our Ben - e - fac - tor. Real - izing that
our beauty was un - bear - a - ble, they cried out: Ho - ly are you! For you
are the One whom no one can ap-proach; yet the world has seen you in the flesh.
And you alone are the Lov-er of all of us.

Just as he promised, Christ appeared in glory today on Mount Tabor, clearly revealing to his disciples the image and reflection of his divinity. Filled with the divine brightness and splendor, the disciples cried out: Let us sing a hymn of victory to God.

Overcome with awe and enlightened with a heavenly brightness, the disciples looked at one another and fell to the ground in their fear and worshipped you, O Master of all.

Confirming this mystery, the voice of God was heard from the cloud; for the Father of lights spoke to the apostles and said: This is my beloved Son. Hear him! *Refrain*

The disciples of the Word beheld an extraordinary mystery on Tabor; and when they heard the voice of the Father, they cried out: This is our Savior, the image of the Father.
