


The refrain is sung three times, once by the priest and twice by the faithful, each time with a prostration.





#### Ode 4






In times past, Moses transformed the bitter wells in the desert with wood; thereby, he prefigured the spreading of the gospel to the Gentiles through the Cross. *Refrain* 

In the days of old, a sharp axe fell into the deep waters of the Jordan; the axe was returned when a stick of wood was thrown Into the waters. This prefigured the cutting down of error by the Cross and baptism. *Refrain* 

Arranged in four divisions as a sacred army, the people of Israel marched in this manner before the ark of the covenant. They were glorified in their ranks which were formed in the sign of the Cross.

## Veneration of the Holy and Life-Giving Cross

While the hymns at the Praises are being sung, the priest vests in all his priestly vestments. At the end of the Great Doxology, during the Trisagion, the priest incenses the Cross at the altar three times. Then, taking the Cross and holding it towards the people, he processes around the altar, through the Northern Doors, and stops in front of the

While this is sung, the priest processes and places the Cross on the tetrapod, incensing it round-about three times. Then the priest takes the Cross, and holding it above his head, says the first petition of the litany while facing the East. The people sing "Lord, have mercy" as the priest bows slowly and then rises up again slowly, while holding the Cross.

This is repeated five times: before the tetrapod, at the other three sides, and again finally before the tetrapod. The Cross is then replaced.









O famous Wood, you are blessed in song for being the Cross on which Christ was crucified. The fiery revolving sword by which Eden was guarded feared you, and the awesome Cherubim bowed down to Christ who was crucified upon you in the flesh. Through this mystery, peace has been granted to our souls.


When the powers of darkness see the sign of the Cross raised on high, they tremble; the multitude of angels and saints in heaven, together with the people on earth, bow down before Christ who grants peace to our souls.















Distorted in body because of age and wasted away by sickness, Jacob was straightened when he crossed his hands, thereby revealing the power of the life-giving Cross. For God, who was crucified upon it in the flesh, rewrote the shadowy Old Law in new letters, and thus drove away the disease of error which corrupts our souls.




When Jacob placed his hands upon the heads of his grandsons in the form of a cross, he indicated that those who serve under the Law would enjoy for a time the honor that is due to the firstborn. Although the error of his act was noticed, he did not change the life-giving figure; for he announced that the newly-formed people of Christ our God, strengthened by the Cross, shall have the higher place.









## **Hymn of Light**

The Cross is the guardian of the universe; the Cross is the beauty of the Church. It is the power of kings, and it sustains the strength of our faith. It is the glory of the angels and the slayer of demons. (2 times)


#### **Psalms of Praise**

Psalm 148 is sung in Tone 8, page 305.


To carry out the sentence pre-ordained: this honor is for all *his* faithful.

He, who was caught up in the third heaven to Paradise and who heard unspeakable and divine words which human beings cannot express, wrote to the Galatians. Study the Scripture, and you will read and understand what he wrote: God forbid that I should glory in anything except the Cross of the Lord on which He suffered the passion. Therefore, let us continue to praise this Cross of the Lord with confidence, for it is the glory of us all. This Wood is our salvation, a weapon of peace, and an unconquerable sign of victory.



By eating of the tree, Adam inherited a corruptible life. He was exiled from Paradise, and his body was prone to corruption which was passed on to his descendants like a disease. But those of the earth, who acknowledge the wood of the Cross as their vindication, cry aloud: You are praised and blessed above all, O God of our Fathers.

Death came into the world by the partaking of the fruit of the free; the breaking of the law of God came through disobedience. The Tree of precious life was carefully guarded until the confession of the good thief. He made it accessible once again by crying out as he departed this life: You are praised and blessed above all, O God of our Fathers.


The Cross is marked upon the foreheads of all God's people, and it is raised up as their sacred horn of strength. By it, all the horns of the spiritual powers of evil are crushed. Therefore, on this day of its exaltation, we worship him and extol you, O Cross.

Today the death that came to man through eating of the tree is made ineffective through the Cross. For the curse of our mother Eve that fell on the human race is destroyed by the pure fruit of the Theotokos, whom all the powers of heaven magnify.

All repeat "Extol..."

You did not want the deadly bitterness of the tree to remain, so you destroyed it through the Cross. In the same way, in times past, the wood destroed the bitterness of the waters of Marah, prefiguring the strength of the Cross that all the powers of heaven magnify.



Through the Cross, O Lord, today you have raised us up again. We were plunged continually in the gloom of our father Adam. Unrestrained greed thrust down our nature into error, but now we have been restored to our full inhertance by the light of the Cross, which we, the faithful, magnify.



To show that the Cross was to be reverenced in all places as being glorious, O Lord, you formed it in the sky, shining with boundless light, as an unconquerable sign for Constantine. All the powers of heaven magnify this Holy Cross.




#### All repeat "Extol..."











