 at last foretelling his second advent to all.

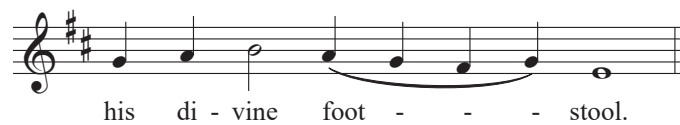

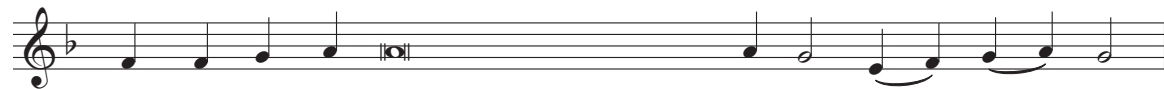

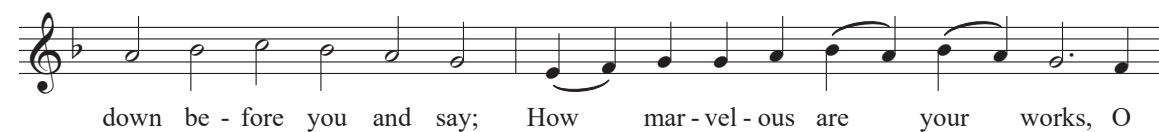
