

This booklet contains a translation of the Hours made by the Inter-Eparchial Liturgical Commission of the Byzantine Catholic Metropolitan Church in the United States, as part of its work on the services of Great and Holy Week, and is based on the Ruthenian edition of the Slavonic *Časoslov* (Rome, 1950).

The proper hymns for December 24 were prepared by the Metropolitan Cantor Institute, and are subject to revision. Music can be found on the Institute website at http://mci.archpitt.org.

Foreword

In the Byzantine tradition, December 24 (the vigil of Christmas) and January 5 (the vigil of Theophany) are days of strict fasting. On these days a special form of the daytime Hours is celebrated, with additional hymns and readings.

These services are called the **Royal Hours**, and are ordinarily celebrated together at some convenient time. (The Typikon prescribes that they be celebrated at 8 AM.) The service of Typika, which is served on days when the Divine Liturgy cannot be celebrated, is added at the end.

Note that if December 24 or January 5 falls on a Saturday or Sunday, the fast and the celebration of the Royal Hours are moved to the preceding Friday, since Saturday and Sunday are never days of fasting in the Byzantine tradition.

Celebrating the Royal Hours

This book assumes a celebration in church, with a priest and deacon. If there are concelebrating priests, the celebrant should lead the first hour. The third, sixth, and ninth hours may each be led by a concelebrating priest. The priest leading each hour proclaims the holy Gospel.

If no priest is present, then the Royal Hours may be led by a deacon or other person (marked below as "leader"). All parts proper to the priest and deacon are omitted. The Gospel book should be placed on an analogion in the middle of the church before the service begins, and the Gospel is read by the leader in a normal speaking voice, facing East (toward the sanctuary).

If the Hours are celebrated separately, then each is preceded by the Beginning Prayers and ends with a dismissal. The Gospel is NOT enthroned in the nave, but brought from the holy table for each reading, as in the Divine Liturgy.

The Beginning Prayers

An analogion is placed before the holy doors so that the priest can read the holy gospel facing the faithful. The priest vests in dark epitrachilion and phelonion, and the deacon vests in the sticharion and orarion. The deacon opens the holy doors. The priest takes the holy gospel from the holy table and carries it in procession to the analogion, where he places it for the reading of the four Gospels. The deacon precedes him carrying a candle. Then the priest stands before the holy doors, facing east, with the deacon at his right, and begins:

If a priest leads the service:

Priest: Blessed is our God, always, now and ever and forever.

Response: Amen.

If other than a priest:

Leader: Through the prayers of our holy fathers, O Lord Jesus Christ our God, have mercy on us.

Response: Amen

Glory to you, our God, glory to you.

Heavenly King, Comforter, Spirit of Truth, everywhere present and filling all things, Treasury of Blessings and Giver of Life, come and dwell within us, cleanse us of all stain, and save our souls, O gracious One.

Holy God, Holy and Mighty, Holy and Immortal, have mercy on us. (*Three times*)

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and forever. Amen.

Most Holy Trinity, have mercy on us; Lord, cleanse us of our sins; Master, forgive our transgressions; Holy One, come to us and heal our infirmities for your name's sake.

Lord, have mercy. (Three times)

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and forever. Amen.

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation,

but deliver us from evil.

If a priest leads the service:

Priest: For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, now and ever and forever.

Otherwise.

All: Amen.

Response: Amen.

Lord, have mercy. (12 times)

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and forever. Amen.

The First Hour

Come, let us worship our King and God. (bow)
Come, let us worship Christ our King and God. (bow)
Come, let us worship and bow before the only Lord Jesus Christ, the King and our God. (bow)

As the psalms are chanted, the celebrant performs a full incensation of the church in this order: the holy gospel book from all four sides; the holy table and the apsidal image; then, going through the holy doors, the icon screen, the interior of the church, any concelebrating clergy, the faithful, the major icons of our Lord and the Theotokos, and the front of the holy table. The deacon precedes the celebrant carrying a candle. The celebrant and deacon return to the sanctuary after the incensation.

Psalm 5

Tone 4. Now and ever and forever. Amen.

Theotokion, Tone 4. What shall we call you, O full of grace? * A heaven, for you have borne the Sun of Justice? *A paradise, for you have brought forth the Flower of immortality? * A virgin, for you have remained undefiled? * A mother, holding in her holy arms the Son who is God of all? * Intercede with him for the salvation of our souls.

During the stichera, the deacon incenses the holy gospel from the four sides, the icon screen and the people, then returns to the sanctuary.

Stichera, Tone 8. Make ready, O Bethlehem: * prepare yourself, O manger. * Let the cave show its welcome. * The truth has come, the shadow has passed away; * born of a Virgin, God has appeared to all, * formed as we are and making our flesh godlike. * Therefore Adam and Eve are renewed, * and they call out: * Loving-kindness has appeared on earth to save our human race.

God comes from Teman, the Holy One from an overshadowed mountain. I have heard your renown and feared.

Tone 3. Now the prophecy draws near to its fulfillment, * which mystically said: * "And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, * where the cave was prepared, * you are not least among princes, * for out of you shall come forth unto me in the flesh a Ruler of nations." * Christ our God is born of a Virgin Maiden, * and as a shepherd he shall tend his people, the new Israel. * Let us all give him glory.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and forever. Amen.

Tone 8. Joseph spoke to the Virgin: * What is this, O Mary, that I see in you? * I fail to understand and am amazed, * and my mind is dismayed. * Depart from me quickly and quietly. * Instead of honor, you have brought me shame; * instead of joy, sorrow; instead of praise, reproof. * No longer shall I bear the reproach of people. * I received you from the priests of the temple as one blameless before the Lord. * And what is this that I now see?

Deacon: Let us be attentive!

Priest: Peace be to all!

Deacon: Wisdom! Be attentive!

Prokeimenon, Tone 4. The Lord said to me: * "You are my Son; this day I have begotten you."

Verse. Ask and I shall bequeath you the nations.

Deacon: Wisdom!

Lector: A reading from the Prophecy of Micah.

Deacon: Let us be attentive!

Lector: Thus says the Lord: But you, Bethlehem-Ephrathah, too small to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel; whose origin is from of old, from ancient times. Therefore the Lord will give them up until the time, when she who is to give birth has borne, and the rest of his brethren shall return to the children of Israel, he shall stand firm and shepherd his flock by the strength of the Lord, in the majestic name of the Lord, his God, and they shall remain, for now his greatness shall reach to the ends of the earth; he shall be peace.

Deacon: Wisdom!

Lector: A reading from the Letter to the Hebrews.

Deacon: Let us be attentive!

Lector: (reads Hebrews 1:1-12)

The priest who will read the Gospel and the deacon come to the analogion through the holy doors for the reading of the gospel.

Deacon: Wisdom! Let us stand and listen to the holy Gospel.

Priest: Peace be to all!

Response: And to your spirit.

Priest: A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew.

Response: Glory to you, O Lord, glory to you.

Deacon: Let us be attentive!

Priest: (reads Matthew 1:18-25)

Response: Glory to you, O Lord, glory to you.

The priest and deacon return to the sanctuary. Then the faithful chant the following verses (Ps. 118:133-135, 70:8):

Guide my footsteps according to your promise, and let no iniquity rule over me.

Redeem me from man's oppression and I shall keep your precepts. Let your face shine on your servant and teach me your decrees.

My mouth is filled with your praise, O Lord, that I may sing your glory all the day long.

Holy God, Holy and Mighty, Holy and Immortal, have mercy on us. (*Three times*)

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and forever. Amen.

Most Holy Trinity, have mercy on us; Lord, cleanse us of our sins; Master, forgive our transgressions; Holy One, come to us and heal our infirmities for your name's sake.

Lord, have mercy. (*Three times*)

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and forever. Amen.

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation,

but deliver us from evil.

If a priest leads the service:

Otherwise.

All: Amen

Response: Amen.

Kontakion, Tone 3. Today the Virgin is coming to the cave * to give birth to the eternal Word * in a manner beyond expression. * Let the world dance when it hears the news; * with the angels and shepherds glorify the eternal God * who chose to appear as a newborn child.

Lord, have mercy. (40 times)

Priest or Leader: O good God, in all times and places you are worshiped and glorified both in heaven and on earth. You are long-suffering and generous in your mercy and compassion. You love the just and show mercy to the sinner, calling all to repentance through the promise of blessings to come. Deem, O Lord, at this very hour, to receive our supplications and to direct our lives in the path of your commandments. Sanctify our souls; purify our bodies; set aright our minds; cleanse our thoughts; deliver us from all affliction, trouble, and distress; surround us with your holy angels so that, guided and guarded in their camp, we may attain oneness of faith and the knowledge of your unspeakable glory. For you are blessed forever and ever.

Response: Amen.

Lord have mercy. Lord have mercy. Lord have mercy.

Glory to the Father and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and forever. Amen.

More honorable than the cherubim, and beyond compare more glorious than the seraphim; who, a virgin, gave birth to God the Word, you, truly the Theotokos, we magnify.

If a priest leads the service:

All: Give the blessing, Father, in the name of the Lord.

Priest: May God be merciful to us and bless us; may He cause His countenance to shine upon us, and have mercy on us.

Response: Amen.

Otherwise:

Leader: Through the prayers of our holy fathers, O Lord Jesus Christ our God, have mercy on us.

Response: Amen.

Priest or Leader: O Christ, you are the true light, who enlightens and sanctifies everyone coming into the world. Sign us with the light of your face, that, walking in it, we may see the light of your unapproachable glory. Direct our steps in the observance of your commands, through the prayers of your most pure Mother and of all your saints.

Response: Amen.

If the Third Hour does not follow immediately, the service concludes with the dismissal on page 47.

Stichera, Tone 6. Such is our God; no other is to be compared to him. * Born of a Virgin, he comes to dwell among us. * Placed in a poor manger, * the Only-begotten Son is seen as a mortal man, * and the Lord of glory is wrapped in swaddling clothes. * A star guides the Magi to come and worship him; * and we sing: O Holy Trinity, save our souls.

God comes from Teman, the Holy One from an overshadowed mountain. I have heard your renown and feared.

Tone 8. Before your birth, O Lord, * the angelic hosts looked with trembling on this mystery * and were struck with wonder: * you adorn the vault of heaven with stars * yet were pleased to be born as a Baby. * You hold all the ends of the earth in the hollow of your hand, * yet were placed in a manger of dumb beasts. * For by such a dispensation have your compassion and great mercy been made known, O Christ. * Glory to you!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and forever. Amen.

Tone 3. Tell us, Joseph, how do you bring to Bethlehem, great with child, * the virgin whom you have received from the sanctuary? * He said: I have searched the prophets * and have been warned by an angel; * and am persuaded that Mary shall give birth to God, * in ways surpassing all interpretation. * Magi from the east shall come to worship him with precious gifts. * O Lord, for our sake you have taken flesh: glory to you!

Deacon: Let us be attentive!

Priest: Peace be to all!

Deacon: Wisdom! Be attentive!

Prokeimenon, Tone 4. For a child is born to us, a Son is given us.

Verse. Upon his shoulder dominion rests.

Deacon: Wisdom!

Lector: A reading from the Prophecy of Jeremiah.

Deacon: Let us be attentive!

Lector: Such is our God; no other is to be compared to him: He has traced out all the way of understanding, and has given her to Jacob, his servant, to Israel, his beloved Son. Since then she has appeared on earth and moved among men. She is the book of the precepts of God, the law that endures forever. All who cling to her will live, but those will die who forsake her. Turn, O Jacob, and receive her: walk by her light toward splendor. Give not your glory to another, your privileges to an alien race. Blessed are we, O Israel; for what pleases God is known to us!

Deacon: Wisdom!

Lector: A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul the Apostle to the Galatians.

Deacon: Let us be attentive!

Lector: (reads Galatians 3:23-29)

The priest who will read the Gospel and the deacon come to the analogion through the holy doors for the reading of the gospel.

Deacon: Wisdom! Let us stand and listen to the holy Gospel.

Priest: Peace be to all!

Response: And to your spirit.

Priest: A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke.

Response: Glory to you, O Lord, glory to you.

Deacon: Let us be attentive!

Priest: (reads Luke 2:1-20)

Response: Glory to you, O Lord, glory to you.

The celebrant and deacon return to the sanctuary. Then the faithful chant the following verses (Ps. 67:20-21):

May the Lord God be blessed; may the Lord be blessed day after day. The God of our salvation will prosper us; this God of ours is a God who sayes.

Holy God, Holy and Mighty, Holy and Immortal, have mercy on us. (*Three times*)

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and forever. Amen.

Most Holy Trinity, have mercy on us; Lord, cleanse us of our sins; Master, forgive our transgressions;

The Symbol of Faith

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible; and in one Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, the only-begotten, born of the Father before all ages. Light from light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, one in essence with

the Father; through whom all things were made. For us and for our salvation, he came down from heaven and was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and became man. He was crucified for us under Pontius Pilate, and suffered and was buried. He rose on the third day according to the scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he is coming again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. And in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the Creator of Life, who proceeds from the Father. Together with the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified; he spoke through the prophets. In one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. I profess one baptism for the remission of sins. I expect the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Remit, pardon, and forgive our transgressions, voluntary and involuntary, in deed and in word, with knowledge and in ignorance, in thought and in desire, by night and by day, forgive them all, O God, for you are good and love us all.

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

Response: Amen.

The priest and deacon return to the altar through the southern door.

If there is no priest, the Royal Hours conclude as follows:

Leader: Through the prayers of our holy fathers, O Lord Jesus Christ our God, have mercy on us.

Response: Amen.
