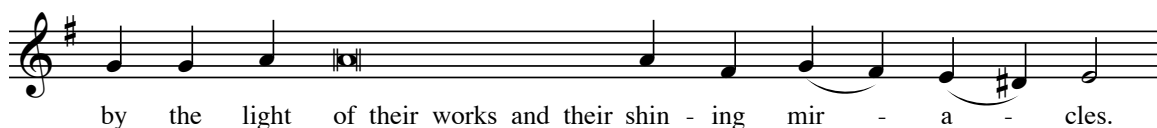

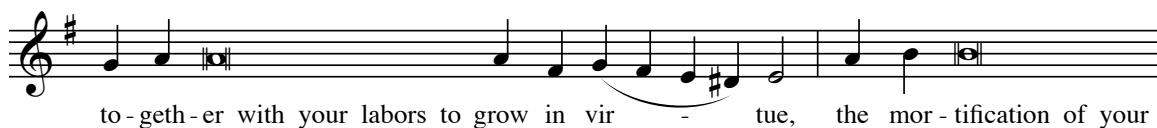

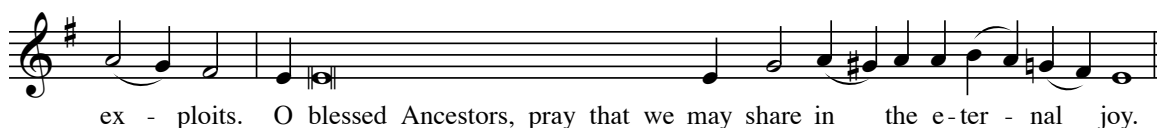

When Sim-eon received him in his arms, he joy-ful-ly cried out:

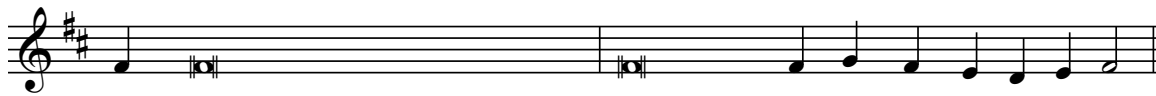

sal - va - tion of the world.

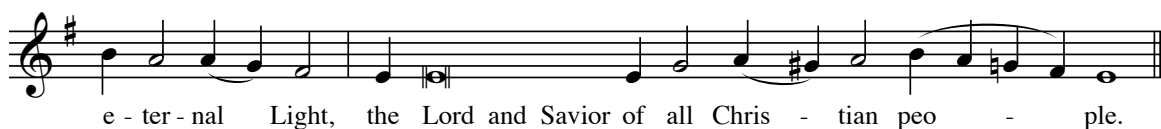
