


Divine Liturgy, July 10, 2011

Our venerable father Anthony of the Monastery of the Caves.


He was a hermit, who in the laura called “the Caves” followed the monastic life which he had learned on Mt. Athos. He was the founder of Russian monasticism.(1073)


you took up res - i - dence in a cave. There you fought the army of in - vis - i - ble

Prokeimenon of the Resurrection - Tone 3 (Psalm 46:7,2):




Sing praise to our God, sing praise; sing praise to our King, sing praise,

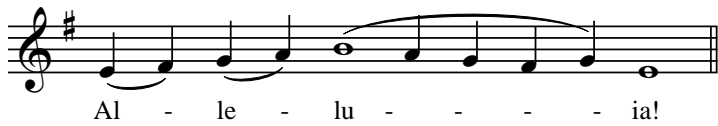

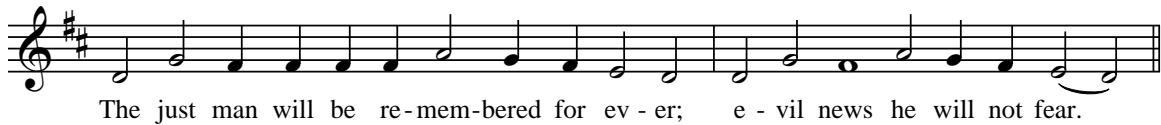


Verse: Happy the man who fears the Lord and greatly delights in his commands.
