Ninth Sunday after Pentecost


Our venerable father Simeon, fool for Christ, and his fellow ascetic John. Simeon, called Salus [i.e., of the sea; he lived for 29 years next to the Dead Sea], at Emesa in Syria. Moved by the divine Spirit, he desired to be considered a fool for Christ and ignoble among people. Likewise the commemoration of St. John, hermit, who for almost thirty years was a companion to St. Simeon in his holy wandering and in a hermitage at the Dead Sea. (590)

Lamplighting Psalms in the Tone of the Week (Tone 8, p. 102), stichera 10-4.


Cantor: (Tone 1) Because with the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption,


