

flows abun-dant - ly from them. We hon - or them as media-tors from the Lord,

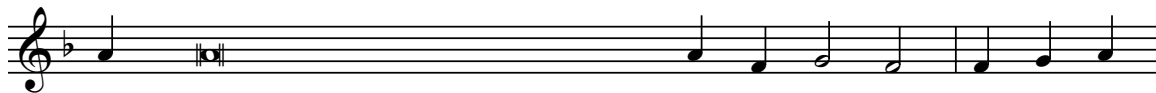


and we fittingly cry out: O our God, glo - ry to You!

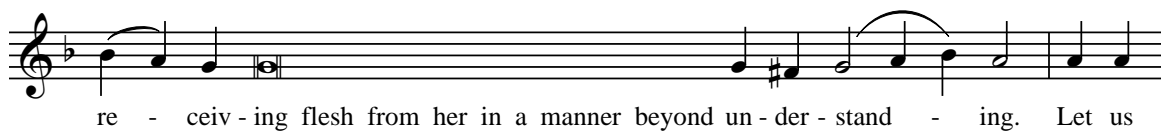
