Cantor: (Tone 5) Glory...


Doxastikon - Tone 5 Bolhar

for all deceit of i-dol-at-ry has ceased, and Christ reigns for-ev-er.





been in-struct-ed by the an - gel. Ask Christ our God to save our souls.

and the service continues with the Blessing of Bread, p. 119.

If there is no Blessing of Bread, the Troparion of the Resurrection in the Tone of the Week (Tone 7, page 101) is sung, then:
