Christ made you a phy-si-cian of souls: a-ble to lance fes-tering wounds with the

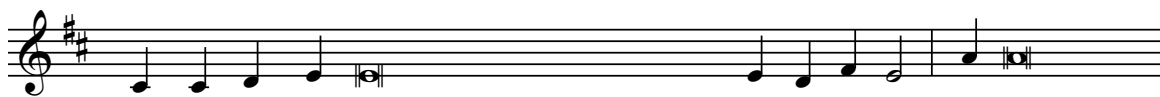


scal-pel of your words, you re-store health to the faith-ful who have re-curse to you.

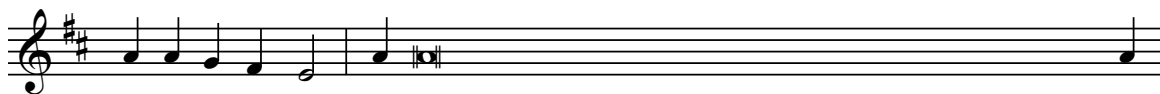


