Our holy fathers Alexander, John, and Paul the Younger, patriarchs of Constantinople. Alexander took part in the First Ecumenical Council. (340) John the Faster governed the Church in the days of the wicked emperor Anastasius. (595) Paul IV governed the Church for five years and then took the Great Schema to repent for his early support of the Iconoclasts. (784)



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


Made foolish by his drunk-en - ness, Her - od was carried away by adultery and voices

of Christ our God. Pray to him, that he save and en-light-en our souls.

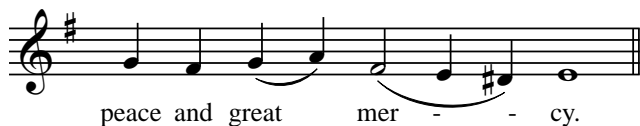

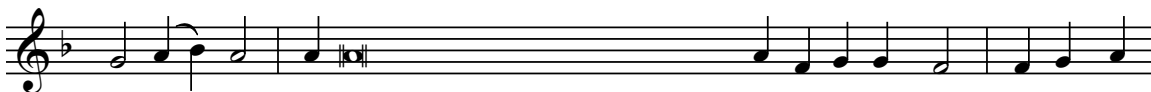
An evil birthday and a lustful banquet is celebrated by Her-od to-day; for having



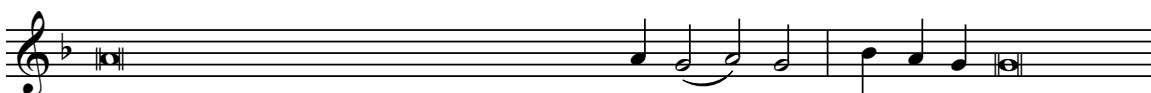
delighted in adultery and being driven by lust-ful de-sires, he be-head-ed the Bap-tist.



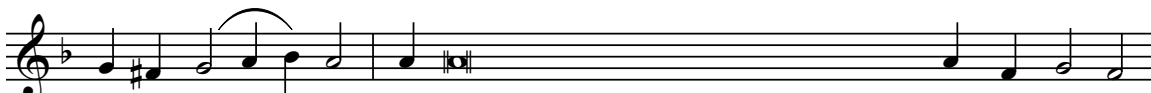
But he could not stop the tongue of the Proph - et which con-demned his
