The holy martyr Paramon was martyred in Bithynia in Asia Minor along with 370 other Christians during the persecution of the governor Aquilinus. (250)



for I am ea - ger to become an acceptable sacri-fice for him

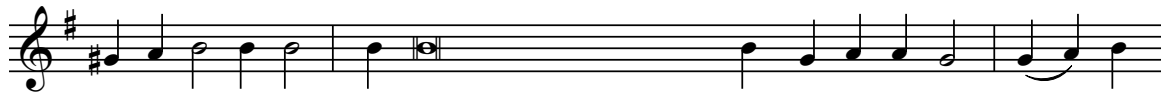


who willed to be immola-ted in the flesh for me."
