
Divine Liturgy, December 6, 2020 TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST


OUR HOLY FATHER NICHOLAS, ARCHBISHOP OF MYRA IN LYCIA, THE

WONDERWORKER. A native of Lycia, he became a monk at the New Sion monastery. When his parents died, he gave his entire inheritance to the poor. Ordained a priest in Patara, he was famous for his almsgiving. He was chosen as archbishop of Myra, and was a model shepherd in his care for the people of his flock. He was present at the First Ecumenical Council (Nicea, 325). Full of years, he entered into rest. (343)

Troparion of our holy father Nicholas the Wonderworker - Tone 4




