Communion Hymn (Ps. 32:1)






Communion Hymn for the Departed (Ps. 64:4a, 101:12b)

And the Alleluia as above.


Communion Hymn (Ps. 111:6b-7a)


Communion Hymn of the Theotokos (Ps. 115:4)
